SUBJECT: Boil Water Rescind Notice for Sheppard AFB, Potable Water System (PWS) ID 2430007, Wichita Falls, Texas

1. On 15 Nov 12, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) directed Sheppard AFB PWS to issue a boil water notification for Sheppard AFB, TX 76311. The notification was issued to inform the patrons of Wind Creek that on 15 Nov 12, Defense Support Services (DS2) had to turn off the water to perform repairs to a water line in the area. This caused the system water pressure to drop below 20 psi. (Defense Support Services was able to conduct the required repairs and restore pressure above 20 psi)
2. In an effort to maintain the health and safety of the base population, the Bioenvironmental Engineering Flight collected representative water samples from the school and housing office to determine the current state of the water quality. These samples were analyzed by a state certified laboratory confirming that the water supply to the building is safe to drink.
3. Our system has taken the necessary corrective actions to restore adequate pressure, disinfectant levels, and/or bacteriological quality and will provide TCEQ with testing results that indicate that the water no longer requires boiling.
